Roads and Trails- Our road remains rutted and rugged, but still easily passable by all manner of 2wd vehicles. Thankfully, a work order has been signed by all required parties and Anaya Contractors will soon perform some much-needed repair work. As of the last check, although the site has greened up, there was not yet the explosion of growth that tends to choke the trails, so (for now) the Red, White, and Green trails are easily passable, with the Blue trail providing a little more of an ungroomed experience.



Buildings/grounds/equipment-. In general, our site is experiencing Spring conditions and there is no new damage or issues to report.

Gold Creek Usage- On April 4, LACC's Geography 20 class had its first visit to Gold Creek, where we walked the Green Trail and measured streamflow in Gold Creek. The course may be the first district course scheduled at "Gold Creek". Restoration contractors and subcontractors have been onsite nearly daily using hand tools to remove invasive weeds. They can be expected onsite any day (Monday through Friday) through May 24.

Abiota- Less than a quarter inch of rain has fallen since our last meeting. Gold Creek currently has flow throughout the

entire site. On several occasions, daytime temperatures have ventured into the 80's, but most days in the last month have seen mild conditions, with highs in the 70's and lows in the 40's.



Biota- All onsite vegetation appears green, vibrant, and well-watered. Grasses and other ground cover have burst into a green display. Bush Poppies continue to bloom, joined by Black Sage, Currant, Bush Mallow, and Ceanothus. I have not noted any mammals of note, or any other animal of note other than the typical assortment of springtime chaparral birds.
