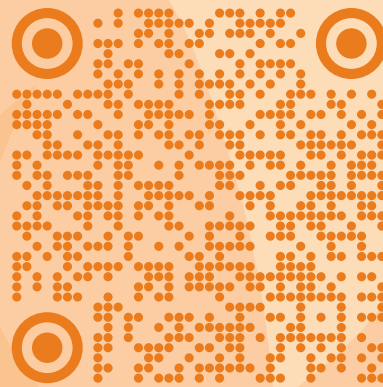


Wildfire Discussion & Career Fair

An engaging **student-focused** lecture on the current wildfire conditions in Los Angeles and neighboring counties, where we will explore the critical geographical and environmental factors that contribute to wildfire risk in this region. Speakers include the honorable Senator Henry Stern, among others.
